### Help with vocabulary

You know who the people are with the best vocabularies? The ones who READ. Yes. In order to be a good writer, you need to be a reader. Read – read the classics (Steinbeck, Twain, Dickens ... oh there are hundreds!). Read Harry Potter or Twilight or the latest Dan Brown. Read the newspaper, read stories to your children, read the back of the cereal box.

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If you don't know the meaning of a word, look it up – and then use it if you can. 😊

Each of the resources listed above will help you become a better writer, but not without ... you guessed it – PRACTICE. The more you write, and the more you read, the better a writer you will become. PRACTICE – look over what you write and edit it. Think about it and change words. Show it to people whose opinion you respect and ask them to help you edit it.

### Here are a few final words of wisdom.

- SHORT is usually better than long.
- SIMPLE is usually better than complicated.
- ACTIVE is usually better than passive.
- USE your school's tutoring center or writing lab.
- ENJOY writing. Once you know what you want to say, figuring out how to say it best should be FUN. Words are a wonderful thing; learn to love them. Poetry, rap music, jokes, scientific research papers – they're all just WORDS trying to get across MEANING and FEELING. Don't be afraid; write, read, rewrite, and ask for help from people you respect.
